Minutes of the regular meeting of the Traffic Safety Advisory Committee of Apple Valley, Dakota County, Minnesota, held May 13, 2026, at 7:00 p.m., at the Apple Valley Municipal Center.

1. Call to Order

Chair Zimmerman called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

2. Approve Agenda

Motion: of Grawe, seconded by Dolan, approving the agenda for tonight's meeting as presented. Ayes - 5 - Nays - 0.

3. Audience

Chair Zimmerman asked if anyone was present to address the Committee, at this time, on any item not on this meeting's agenda.

4. Approval of Minutes

A. Approve the minutes of the regular meeting of March 11, 2026

There were no amendments to the proposed minutes.

Motion: of Saam, seconded by Grawe, approving the minutes of the meeting of March 11, 2026. Ayes - 5 - Nays – 0.

5. Regular Agenda

A. Gallery & 157th Street Stop Sign

Mr. Acosta said the City received a stop sign request for Gallery where it meets 157th Street. There are stop signs at the other similar intersections with 157th Street in that neighborhood. The missing stop sign appears to be an oversight and is recommended for consistency in traffic controls.

Motion: of Grawe, seconded by Zimmerman, recommending the installation of the stop sign as recommended by the City Engineer. Ayes - 7 - Nays – 0.

B. Fernando Ave Speed Concerns between 140th Street and Fair Oak Lane

Mr. Acosta said the initial concern was regarding vehicle speeds, but was later expanded to lack of sidewalks. The addition of sidewalks could be considered when the roadway is reconstructed. The 85th percentile speeds are 26.35 mph and 24.08 mph, which are well under the 30 mph speed limit in both directions. The Committee consensus was to continue to monitor traffic on the roadway.

C. Request for Crosswalk on Johnny Cake Ridge Road near Lebanon Hills Park and the School of Environmental Studies (ISD 196 Capstone Project)

Mr. Anderson introduced School of Environmental Studies (SES) student Natalie Munson who presented the request. Many of the SES students cross Johnny Cake from the school to do research studies in the Lebanon Hills Regional Park. Mr. Anderson said an RRFB might be a solution, but said it would be necessary to determine where the County plans to have the North Creek Greenway cross Johnny Cake Ridge Road to reach the parks facility at Jenson Lake.

6. Informational Items

A. Other Concerns Communicated to the City

Police – There were no other concerns reported by the Police Department.

Public Works – Mr. Acosta said the City received a number of speed complaints on Butte Avenue, which just recently reopened for the season. Public Works will be sending post cards to the neighborhood, as the traffic on Butte is almost entirely from within the neighborhood.

Mr. Acosta said concerns continue over traffic on County Road 46. The County released a memo addressing various requests for changes and enforcement on County Road 46.

Mr. Acosta said driver feedback signs have been scheduled for Pennock Avenue north of 140th Street, Fernando Avenue, and Ferris Avenue.

B. Educational Issues

Ms. Dolan said there would be an upcoming Metro area workshop. Mr. McKenzie said the number of concerns and issues relating to the use of small battery powered vehicles on sidewalks and pathways is increasing rapidly.
